## MSP ANNUAL FACULTY SURVEY

This survey will assess your involvement with the Graduate Program in Molecular and Systems Pharmacology (MSP) over the past year. The purpose is to track program involvement and to encourage engagement in the MSP Program. This annual survey is required of all MSP faculty members and should take less than 10 minutes of your time. A link will be sent to all current MSP faculty members each year.

Satisfactory participation includes a requirement to:

- 1) teach at least once every year in an MSP course, and
- 2) be involved in at least one of the other two categories, Research Training or Administration.

Examples of each category are given below.

- MSP 570r & 790r Introductory/Advanced Graduate Seminar
- MSP 717 Principles of Therapeutic Discovery

## 2. Research Training:

- Having a dissertation student in your lab
- Holding membership on dissertation committees of MSP students
- Attending a significant number of student seminars and dissertation defense seminars
- Participating in program-organized and training grant related presentations and symposia.

## 3. Administration:

- Holding any executive office of the MSP Program
- Holding an executive office in the GDBBS or Laney Graduate School (<u>not</u> another GDBBS program)
- Writing and grading questions for the MSP Qualifying Exam (Part I)
- Grading research grant proposals for the MSP grant writing course
- Participating in MSP recruitment and admissions efforts
